

Translation Milestones

- Suryoyo—Old Testament first draft is about two thirds completed and progressing well.
- Assyrian—The published New Testament plus Psalms was dedicated at the
 March meeting of the board of directors
 of ABT. Pray for the translators now
 working on Old Testament translation.
- Ma'luli—Translators completed their work on the New Testament in March.
 Pat Bennett and the technical team at Jerome Institute are now doing final checking of spelling and terminologies.
 Once that is completed the finalized text will be typeset for publications. Work continues on Old Testament translation.
- Mardini—Old Testament translation is proceeding. They are starting translation of 1 Chronicles.
- Chaldean—Pray for additional workers for the translation project. The team is continuing to translate Genesis.
